





The boards of Carpathia and North Winnipeg credit unions propose that our member-owned financial institutions unite to form a single, stronger credit union focused on the needs of our members, employees and Winnipeg's Ukrainian community. To proceed, the proposal requires the approval of the members of both credit unions. We urge you to join us to cast your vote at a special member meeting on **Tuesday, April 16 at 7:30pm, Canad Inns Garden City.**

We make this recommendation to merge only after months of analysis, negotiations and due diligence. The advantages of amalgamation are many: significant operating efficiencies, an expanded branch network, more capacity to meet demand for new and enhanced services

(especially digital technology) and the financial strength and clout that comes from simply being bigger. You will continue to receive excellent service — in English and Ukrainian — with the competitive rates and low fees you've come to expect from the cooperative financial institution that belongs to you.

Since we first began exploring the possibility of amalgamation, the directors and executive of both credit unions have been adamant that the new entity continues to support Winnipeg's Ukrainian community with sponsorships, scholarships and financial support for events and organizations. We have also been in unanimous agreement that we must honour the rich histories of both Carpathia and North Winnipeg, and commit to keeping their legacies alive in our new credit union.

We are excited about the possibilities this amalgamation represents and sincerely hope you will share our excitement as you learn what it will mean for you, your credit union and your community. You'll find some general information about our proposal at cu2019.ca. We invite you, though, to join us at our Carpathia Credit Union member information meeting on Tuesday, April 9 at 7:30pm, Canad Inns Garden City, where we'll provide more details and answer your questions. And please exercise your right as a member-owner to vote on the proposal on Tuesday, April 16 at 7:30pm also at Canad Inns Garden City.

We strongly believe this amalgamation is the right thing to do, and urge you to vote in favour.

APPLY NOW

The Carpathia Credit Union Scholarship rewards all-around excellence and is awarded each year on the basis of high academic standing and noteworthy participation in extracurricular activities in and outside of school, our Ukrainian community, and the community-at-large. To be eligible for this scholarship, the applicant must be:

- A member of Carpathia Credit Union since at least September 1, 2017 or have a parent/guardian that has been a member in good standing for at least the past three years.
- Currently attending high school and graduating in June 2019
- Attending an approved post-secondary institution in the fall of 2019



All eligible applicants will be considered for a Carpathia Credit Union Scholarship. A selection committee will adjudicate the applications and select the scholarship recipients. The scholarship will be awarded to the recipient upon proof of paid registration at an approved post-secondary institution.

More & more Canadians turning to e-Transfers to send and receive payments

According to a recent report by Interac, the popularity of e-Transfers is exploding as Canadians embrace the new technology's speed and convenience. e-Transfers allow users to send and receive money electronically through an email or text message. Unlike cheques, e-Transfers cannot bounce, as the funds are guaranteed. Funds can also be sent and received almost instantly.

According to the report, which was based on 2017 data, there are now an average of 7.5 million active e-Transfer users each month. Canadian made 241.4 million e-Transfers in 2017, worth a combined \$92.4 billion. Of those transfers, 62 per cent were transfers of \$200 or more, and three quarters of them (76 per cent) were completed using a mobile device.

However, as e-Transfers have increased in popularity, so too has the occurrence of e-Transfer fraud. If you receive an e-Transfer you were not expecting, be suspicious. If possible, contact the sender directly to confirm that they sent the transfer.

Graduating this spring?Time to start thinking about retirement!

If you're set to graduate from high school, college or university this spring, you have a million things on your mind, such as how to land that dream job or what adventure you want to tackle next.

One thing likely not on your mind is retirement — but it ought to be. While it's never too late to start saving for your retirement, the earlier you get started the better.

Let's consider someone who's 10 years away from their desired retirement date. If they were to invest \$554.90 monthly in a mutual fund with an average rate of return of eight per cent, they'd be able to build a nest egg of \$100,000. By starting earlier, say 20 years, they'd only need to put away \$175.66 a month to get that \$100,000 nest egg. If they started 30 years ahead, that monthly contribution would only need to be \$66.66 and by starting 40 years ahead, they'd only have to put away \$28.50 a month to save \$100,000.

The point being that the sooner you begin making regular contributions to an RRSP, the sooner you can begin taking advantage of the power of compound interest to maximize your savings. Best of all, if you start right away, you'll never even miss the monthly contributions.

Cyber fraud is on the rise — do you know how to protect yourself?

Cyber attacks and cyber fraud are becoming increasingly popular methods for criminals to prey on unsuspecting victims. As more and more of our financial lives move online, the importance of safeguarding yourself against cyber crime only increases.

The RCMP has a number of helpful cyber crime prevention tips to help Canadians safeguard themselves. Here are some of the highlights:

- Use strong passwords. The RCMP recommends using different combinations of user IDs and passwords for different sites. You should also ensure your passwords contain letters, numbers and special characters and aren't something that could be easily guessed (like birthdays or pet's names, for example). You should also change your passwords on a regular basis.
- Secure your computer. Make sure your computer's firewall is activated, use anti-virus software to prevent malware from infecting your computer and block spyware attacks by keeping your anti-spyware software up to date.
- Install the latest operating systems. Whether you're using a PC or a Mac or any other type of computer, it's good practice to keep the operating system and your application up to date to prevent potential attacks on older software.
- Secure your wireless network. Home wi-fi can be vulnerable to attacks if not properly secured. Review your settings to make sure. Also, avoid using free public wi-fi for any sort of sensitive transactions.
- Secure your mobile devices. Only download applications from trusted sources in order to avoid potential vulnerabilities.
